For three years, the team at MOCA Toronto has worked toward one major milestone: the relaunch of a new, expanded museum in the Tower Automotive Building, a heritage site on Sterling Road. In late September of 2018, we proudly celebrated that momentous event together with our partners, donors, and community.

With the doors now open, we have the opportunity to shift the conversation from construction to artists, exhibitions, and making MOCA Toronto an international cultural destination. Cultural destinations aren't built overnight but there is great momentum around MOCA in our community and across the city and we have confidence that this landmark building and museum will lead to growth and opportunity in the coming years and decades.

We have been so encouraged by the response from the public thus far. In a few short months after opening our doors, over 30,000 visitors have demonstrated their support for MOCA, from the sold-out opening weekend to the impressive number of members who joined.

Huge thanks are owed to all of our supporters, donors, and staff, as well as to the board members, whose extraordinary commitment ensured governance models and procedures were put in place for the successful functioning of the new MOCA Toronto.

We are tremendously excited to the embark on our first year of joint leadership. We plan to initiate a multitude of opportunities for further dialogue — delving into the playful, sharing in participatory moments — and together with you all, consider the impact art and culture can have in society.

We have already seen how our projects can be enriched through dynamic collaborations both local and global, with our onsite partners Akin, Art Metropole, Ontario Science Centre, Toronto Biennial of Art, and Forno Cultura. These partners offer the potential for cross-pollination among skill sets and disciplines. We want to continue to be outward-facing by inviting new relationships to develop. By focusing on how the museum can be useful to its community and continuously evolving, we hope MOCA will become a part of people's everyday lives — a tangible and inspiring space that goes beyond the traditional definition of a museum.

Change is a moniker we'll move forward with, as we set strategies and outline goals to allow MOCA to open and collaborative and engage more broadly with cultural partners across the city.

A change in leadership certainly sets a new path to the future, but it is equally important to remember the road recently travelled. Through this report, we reflect backward, proudly celebrating our accomplishments of the past year. It's a delight to share our successes with you who support our vision and help create an engaging experience for visitors of all ages.
